Fish Blocks in Three Sizes

Materials:

Large Fish

- Selvedge fabrics
 - o 5" square (2)
 - o 3.25" square (2)
- Background fabric
 - o 5" square (3)

Medium Fish

- Selvedge fabrics
 - o 4.5" square (2)
 - o 3" square (2)
- Background fabric
 - o 4.5" square (3)

Small Fish

- Selvedge fabrics
 - o 2.5" square (2)
 - o 1.75" square (2)
- Background fabric
 - o 2.5" square (3)



Assembly Instructions:

- 1. Fold one of the larger and both small selvedge squares for your desired fish size in half and press.
- 2. Open the two smaller squares and place each in a corner of a background square with raw edges even and fold line running across the corner.
- 3. Stitch each of these in the fold line, refold, and press. This will make one of the corners a selvedge corner on each of the two blocks. Set aside.
- 4. Place the large, folded selvedge square in one corner of the remaining background square and baste along raw edges only.
- 5. You should now have four squares of equal size. Lay these out to form your fish design and stitch together the four patches. If desired, you can roll the folded edge of the tail and stitch down, giving it a curved appearance. See photo for layout idea.
- 6. Make many more and enjoy!

Notes:

- These blocks should be set on point for a quilt design.
- The fish can swim in any direction, so play around with design and make a rogue fish going the other way, doing his own thing. Be creative.
- The small and the medium fish work well in a quilt together, as the sizes are compatible.
